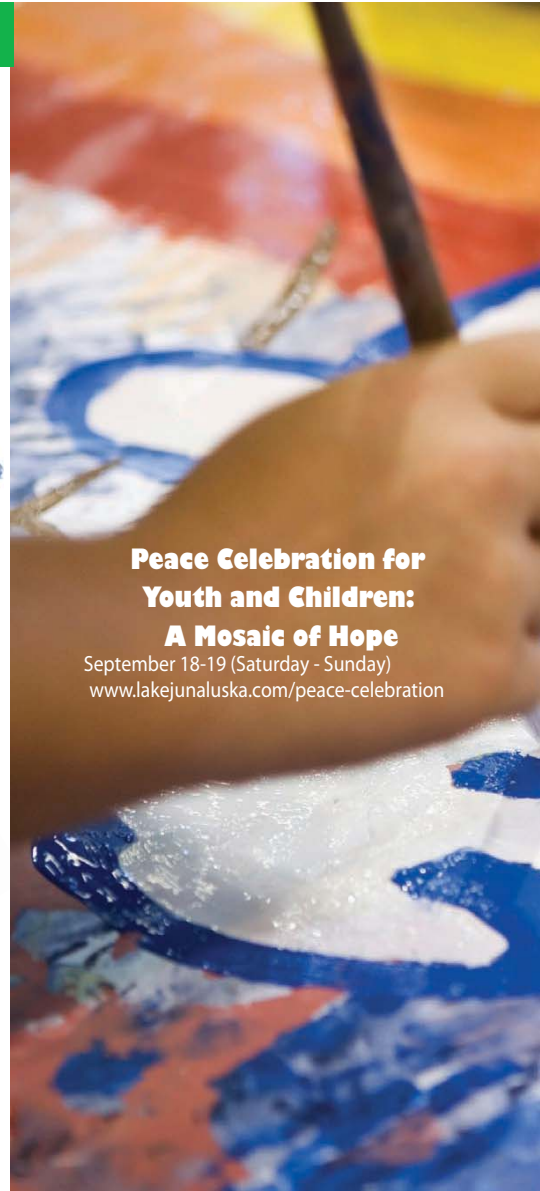

Marian Wright Edelman

Marian Wright Edelman is a lifelong advocate for disadvantaged Americans and is the President of the Children's Defense Fund (CDF). Under her leadership, CDF has become the nation's strongest voice for children and families. Mrs. Edelman is a graduate of Spelman College and Yale Law School. She was the first African-American woman admitted to the Mississippi Bar. Mrs. Edelman founded the Washington Research Project, a public interest law firm and the parent body of the Children's Defense Fund.

Jeni Stepanek, Ph. D, is a noted advocate for children's and families' needs in health and education, and she is a motivational speaker on topics ranging from disability to hope, peace, and spirituality. Jeni has received several honors for her humanitarian efforts. In 2009, she penned an inspirational memoir

of her son's life, "Messenger: The Legacy of Mattie J.T. Stepanek and Heartsongs." Jeni currently works as a consultant for many disability- and peace-related projects and is a mentor for teenagers around the world who participate in the annual "Three Dot Dash Just Peace Summit."

The plight and the promise of children will be featured during the 2010 Lake Junaluska Peace Conference through keynote speaker presentations and workshops which will prepare us to be strong advocates for children in every arena of our lives.

Celebration participants will engage in hands on learning experiences with various organizations that are working for peace and that are meeting the needs of youth and children throughout the world. They will also have a chance to respond through art and action about what they've learned. On Sunday afternoon, all attendees are invited to participate in the first annual Peace Walk around Lake Junaluska, which symbolizes our efforts as a community to work towards peace.
